The MISASA & SAGPA Amalgamation/Merger Concept

The concept has been bandied around for quite a while. In 2021, SAGPA hit a major bump in the road with regards to the ARO's status. I do not want to discuss the reasons, dynamics or merits of this failure. What need to mention is that we made an effort to assist in this that a proposal was made that we merge and in so doing assist not only the members to be legally compliant but also to increase our recreational aviation stake. **Brett Hickman** had presented our concept to the SAGPA members that attended the North meets South event held at Gariep. The process never gained traction thereafter. Several discussions were held around the concept to me finally convening a final meeting with the MISASA committee on the specific topic. The outcome of the meeting was promptly conveyed to the SAGPA Chairman, **Andre van Zyl**.

RESOLUTION: MISASA DOES NOT pursue the motion of the absorption with SAGPA. The supporting arguments are that BOTH ARO's would be diluting our Recreational Aviation VOICE, REPRESENTATION & VOTING POWER within all the structures we serve, for example, The Aeroclub, Sub Coms, ILF's, AP Panel etc. but not limited to.

PROPOSAL 1: MISASA extends the hand of co-operation and assistance where possible in getting the SAGPA ARO status back to current as soon as possible.

PROPOSAL 2: A proposal is presented insofar that a bi-lateral agreement to be entered on to accommodate pilots that happen to also be active WCM, LSA (NPL) pilots. This would merely require the minimum admin to keep track of. It would effectively entail that the pilot, that happens to own and fly a gyro, would have the choice of which ARO he wishes to belong to considering that the MISASA ARO MOP makes provision for all factory-built NTCA's up to 1663kg's excluding Gliders and Aerobatic aeroplanes.

Subsequently to this, SAGPA held their AGM and a new committee has been elected with **Weidie Vors**ter as Chairman and **Dr George Coetzee** as his vice-chairman. **Thelma** has been re-contracted to resume the administrative role after the previous committee had terminated her valuable services. **Yolande** has also been contracted to resolve the validity of the ARO. I have made good on the MISASA offer of assistance to the SAGPA team on behalf of MISASA and look forward to a renewed vigour and partnership between MISASA & SAGPA.

AEROCLUB of SA

I convey our most sincere appreciation to Aeroclub's **Rob Jonkers & Marthinus Potgieter** that have continuously and actively sacrificed hours and hours with their engagement with CAA on several matters. The battle is relentless and they have most definitely risen to the occasion. They spend hours on and in Virtual Meetings (and still do) and have been a part of facilitating and fighting to benefit all of us in the recreational aviation industry! I was hoping that we could have provided some really good news with regards to the Part 96 issues regarding flipping operations but that is still a work in progress. MISASA also adopted an approach of using the Aeroclub's Newsletter as our official mouthpiece during COVID. As things are changing back to normality, we will be resuming our MailChimp Newsletters along with content from SAGPA and vice versa.

MISASA & GASS

I was forced to withdraw from the GASS - Devolution of Power Focus Group due to the relentless diluting of my contribution and attendance on behalf of MISASA. Apart from this, valuable time was wasted by persistently revisiting previous meetings and briefing newcomers to the meetings. This was in total contradiction to the terms we had agreed on at the onset of participation. In terms of our MOA with AeroclubSA, **Rob Jonkers** now fulfils this role. Post my departure, which may have rattled some cages, we were finally asked to formulate a concept for the DOP. MISASA along with other Aeroclub ARO's contributed our long-standing "wish list" as a foundation or departure point for the group. I may add that the majority of the salient points had been relentlessly presented by several Aeroclub ARO's the past couple of years as we engaged in workshops and liaison forums. My personal opinion is that there is a serious disconnect within CAA. I find it troubling that for example, in the case of DTO's that one CAA department can actively use inputs and guidance from industry and work as a harmonious team whilst another rebukes our expertise in favour of a monotonous "this is our forum, you are here, by invitation" narrative. It is thus my assumption that this is merely a tick box exercise and I need to "run for the hills" by even daring to make the comments.

AP Panel Representation

Rowena, assisted by Stefan, has had this responsibility since the inception of the panel. Rowena sacrificed hours upon hours prior to its initial official implementation and was an integral cog during the document sifting & sorting process post RAASA. Stefan Coetzee will now take the lead role as MISASA representative on the AP Panel whilst Rowena still heads up the technical portfolio. She will now have more time for the Quality Assurance role within the ARO. We are busy with the sifting process of identifying someone to assist Stefan going forward. Noteworthy that this person is not required to serve on the MISASA committee but is ultimately bound by the TOR and accountable to the committee.

Finances

We have "frozen" our membership fees at R 410 for 7 years now and we are most definitely not going to change that for 2022. We have weathered the storm and the MISASA financial position remains healthy. It is for this reason, I will not be calling for an increase, however, **Brett Hickman** can report on the AGM.

We sincerely thank him for his valued contributions on the committee and the at times vibrant yet constructive discussions we all had. Best wishes to you Dale. Thelma will continue in her valuable administrative role including taking care of the SAGPA administrative function, adding to the renewed working relationship between MISASA & SAGPA. Depending on the outcome of the AGM, there may be a slight portfolio shuffle. Both Kevin Storie & Yolande Combrinck are available for their co-opted roles. Needless to say, John Boucher is available to duty in the hot seat again. We have a well-oiled, well-balanced, smooth operating representative MISASA TEAM!
