Mandate of ECP

- ☐ Enforce regulations, codes and standards for the energy& petroleum sectors
- Enforce EHS and quality standards for the P&G, ERE, ER in coordination with other statutory authorities for the energy & petroleum sectors
- Enforce directions to ensure compliance with conditions of licenses or permits issued in the Energy & Petroleum sectors
- Investigate complaints or disputes between parties with grievances over any matter required to be regulated under this the Energy Act



Mandate of ECP

- Impose sanctions and penalties on persons who are in breach of any of the provisions of this Act or any regulations made there under
- Develop the Authority's customer service charter and monitor its implementation
- Sensitize and educate stakeholders on EPRA mandate and regulatory changes
- Approve licensee's customer service charters and complaints handling procedure
- Ensure compliance with customer service charters within the Energy sector



Mandate of ECP

- ☐ Fuel Marking & Monitoring Programme
- LPG Compliance Inspection Programme



Surveillance Inspections

- Inspections conducted on a weekly basis across all Regions
- Random inspections on Petroleum & Gas facilities,
 Electricity & Renewable Energy and Economic Regulation
- Inspections also based on recommendations from Technical Audit findings



Surveillance Inspections Cont..

- Liquefied Petroleum Gas
 - Random surveillance/inspections on petroleum retail stations
 - Random surveillance/inspections on LPG Storage & filling facilities
- ☐ Random surveillance/inspections on LPG Retail & Wholesale sites
- Random surveillance/inspections on LPG road tankers & LPG cylinders transport vehicles



Enforcement of the LPG Regulations

Offences

- Unauthorized refilling without permission from brand owner –LN 100 (14)
- Refilling/retailing of un-embosed, defaced/tampered cylinder
- Refilling cylinders from unlicensed sites
- Retail/wholesale of cylinders without seals
- ☐ Possession of illegal seals
- Damage of cylinders i.e. scrappage, removal of safety valves, altering brand name/symbol/repainting



Enforcement of the LPG Regulations

Offences

- Unauthorized wholesale/retail of a cylinder without permission from brand owner
- Retailing and wholesaling of a cylinder that do not conform to the Kenya Standards
- ☐ Transporting more than three (3) filled cylinders without a license
- Random surveillance/inspections on LPG road tankers & LPG cylinders transport vehicles
- Keeping of records -LN 100 (18-3)



Enforcement procedures

- □ Done on non-compliant LPG facilities
- First step is usually issuance of compliance notices as provided for in Section 91 & 99 of the Petroleum Act 2019
- Failure to adhere leads to enforcement sanctions as provided for the in the Act
- Involves use of officers from the National Police Service/
 Directorate of Criminal Investigations



- Enforcement Methods
 - Issuance of show cause letters
- ☐ Warning letters
- License suspension/revocation notices
- Demand Notices
- Improvement Notices
- ☐ Closure/Demolition Notices
- Prosecution



- LPG enforcement in numbers (2019)
- ☐ 345 LPG sites inspected
- ☐ 3 illegal LPG sites demolished
- 8 licenses suspended
- 67 stop orders for non-compliant sites



Offences

Offence	<i>Penalty/Fine in Kenya</i> <i>Shillings</i>
Importation, exportation or transportation of LPG without a valid licence issued by the Authority	Not less than KShs. 10,000,000
Resale of bulk LPG to another person for purposes of export or retail or final use without a valid licence issued by the Authority	Not less than KShs. 1,000,000
Use of a vehicle for purposes of transport of bulk LPG that does not possess a valid permit issued by the Authority	Not less than KShs. 1,000,000
Driving a vehicle or engaging a driver for the purpose of transport of bulk LPG without a valid driver certificate issued by the Authority	Not less than KShs. 250,000

Offences

Offence	Penalty/Fine in Kenya Shillings
Non-display of original or certified copy of licence or permit issued by the Authority at the premises of operation	Not exceeding KShs. 1,000,000
Operation of a non-licenced LPG facility	Not less than KShs. 10,000,000
Import of LPG through undesignated routes	A fine not less than Kshs. 200,000
Supply of Bulk LPG to facilities not licensed under these Regulations other than LPG consumer facilities.	Kshs. 500,000 for each delivery to a non-licensed facility



Company details:

- a. Brand name.
- b. Customer service number.
- c. Emergency contacts.
- d. KEBS standardization mark.

What to check when buying LPG during cylinder refill:

- a. Check condition of valve.
- b. Weight of cylinder against tare weight.
- c. Check that the seal is intact and genuine.
- d. Request cylinder use demonstration if not sure.



How to handle and store:

- a. Keep the cylinder in upright position when transporting and storing.
- b. Observe separation distance between cylinder and stove/cooker/oven
- c. Keep the cylinder in an airy place.
- d. Do not rollover, throw or bang the cylinder.
- e. Do not store cylinders in exits or aisles.
- f. Avoid exposing cylinders to rain and direct sun.



How to use LPG cylinder

- a. Ensure the hose, regulator or burner is well fitted.
- b. When using a rubber hose, ensure there are no visible cracks. Replace hose after

three years.

- c. Strike match before turning on LPG burner or regulator.
- d. Never leave the burner un-attended during use.
- e. Ensure to turn off LPG burner or regulator after use.
- f. Ensure that you get LPG from genuine gas suppliers and source.



What to do in case of LPG leakage:

- a. When you smell LPG odor, do not panic.
- b. Don't turn on any electrical appliances or light switch.
- c. Turn off LPG regulator.
- d. LPG is heavier than air; hence open the lowest openings such as doors, in
- addition to windows.
- e. Remove the cylinder out of the room.
- f. Inform the wholesaler or the brand owner.




























- Information Gathering
 - Surveillance Inspections
- Intelligences from other Govt agencies i.e. KRA, NIS, NPS
- Complaints reporting
- Recommendations from technical audits findings



- Enforcement Instruments
 - ☐ Energy Act 2019, Petroleum Act 2019
 - ☐ Other relevant Acts (EMCA, 1999, OSHA 2007 etc)
 - ☐ Regulations
 - Kenya Standards
 - ☐ Policies (Compliance & Enforcement Policy)
 - Penal Codes



Consumer Protection

- Key functions
- ☐ Implement Consumer Protection Policy
- ☐ Maintain complaints register
- Sensitize and inform public through forums
- Resolution of complaints within 30 days
- Enforce recommendations on accidents/incidents from technical directorates



Consumer Protection (LPG Matters)

- ☐ Report any complaint to the Authority
- Complaints on under filling, illegal retail and wholesale
- Accidents and incidents



LPG Compliance Inspection Programme

Monitor LPG Compliance Inspections as follows:

- 1. Inspect LPG Storage and filling facilities
- 2. Inspect LPG Wholesale and Retail Sites
- 3. Inspect LPG road tankers across the country
- 4. Close down/Demolish illegal LPG sites
- 5. Inspect LPG cylinder revalidation plants
- The services undertaken by Bureau Veritas Kenya Limited.
- Done on a monthly basis in conjunction with EPRA staff
- This has been in force since 2015.



LPG Compliance Inspection Programme

Activity	Sites Inspected	Compliant	Non- compliant	Percentage
LPG Road Tankers	83	75	8	90
LPG Wholesale & Retail Sites	1300	450	850	40
LPG Storage sites	28	24	4	81
AVERAGE				83.33



LPG Compliance Inspection Programme Major milestones:

- Sealing of unlicensed facilities now on real time basis.
- □ Technical audit findings now being implemented
- Demolition powers now in the Act hence no need of court orders-lengthy.
